Thank you to those of you who were able to attend the reading meeting this week. As part of our theme Fox Tor are looking at world rivers. In English we are working on a non-fiction book called Everest and will be transferring our skills to write a book about rivers.

On BBC Four there is a short series on Earths Great Rivers. Last week was the Amazon, last night the Nile and next weeks is the Mississippi. I would really like our children to watch them but we just don't have the time in the school day.
