Brentor News

In Brentor, we have been exploring non-fiction texts. In English, we have been looking at the book Hidden World; Ocean. From our learning, we have been researching lots of different sea creatures including jellyfish, sea turtles, goblin shark and a whale shark etc. Some of our favourite facts included "a sea turtle can be heavier than a car", "jellyfish have not got any lungs, heart or eyes and they're not even a fish." and "jellyfish are 95% water".

We have been focusing on independent writing and have all been amazed with Brentor's resilience and resourcefulness to support this.

As well as learning about the sea creatures, we have been learning about how plastic pollution is affecting our ocean habitats and the small changes we can make as a class to help protect our environment. We are very excited about our upcoming trip to Crooklets Beach, Bude, where we will be working alongside the "2 Minute Foundation" to reinforce our current themed learning.

In the afternoons, Yes Tor have been joining us as part of their transition preparation for September, which has been brilliant for us all.

Fox Tor News

On Thursday 23rd June, Fox Tor went to see the SS Great Britain in Bristol to enrich their learning about Isambard Kingdom Brunel, his innovations and lasting legacy. It was an amazing experience for everybody. We got to take part in a workshop discovering more about Brunel as an Engineer, his successes and failures. We loved the fact that this never stopped him from trying again, inventing new things that changed the lives of Victorians and inspired the next generation and beyond. We were able to make links with our learning dispositions. We stepped back in time on a guided tour of the SS Great Britain. We all found it really fascinating, although the mannequins were a little creepy.

In the afternoon, we had the opportunity to dress up as Victorians, explore the museums which included going into Brunel's mind. Stepping below the water line, we were able to walk around the hull of the ship and see the vast size of the famous propellor.

Our successful enterprise project making and selling wildflower seed bombs made our trip even more special and significant. We raised over £500 towards the enrichment trip. The whole experience has been such wonderful, real life learning journey and one that we will all remember and cherish.

It has been a busy month in Great Links Tor! The majority of the class visited Bristol for their residential where they visited the aquarium, zoo and SS Great Britain. The adults who accompanied the class were impressed by all of the children who represented the school brilliantly. Those who stayed in school were also fantastic and enjoyed the activities they undertook.

In maths, the pupils are learning how to draw and measure angles using protractors. There have been some great links made between skateboard moves and angles which has made the learning more realistic.

In English, we have begun to look at the text "My Secret War Diary" by Marcia Williams based a diary written by Flossie Albright. We are using this to base our learning about controlling formality in our own writing. We have also used this text in Guided Reading to summarise and empathise.

We have been planning to create a webpage in computing.
