School Improvement:

Some of the staff completed the final training day for RWI. We are really pleased with the amount of positive comments from parents and staff about the impact that you are noticing already since we have implemented the scheme. Your support is greatly appreciated, thank you. We have definitely noticed how quickly the pupils are progressing with their phonics and reading.

Mrs McMorrow attended a "narrowing the word gap" training day and has already implemented suggestions from the course. She will now lead whole school training on this as we know how important this aspect of education is in developing readers and ultimately learners.

Mrs Abbott-Bray has also attended more subject leader training to support her with leading English across the school. As you can imagine, it is a huge role so it is important that ongoing training is attended.

Miss Davy attended an English hub meeting where the focus was on vocabulary and reading. The guest speakers were as passionate as we are about reading. As a result of the meeting, Miss Davy has expressed an interest in our school taking part in a research project about teachers reading to children – more news to follow as soon as we hear if we have been successful!

Mrs Sutherland has been monitoring science across the school and has introduced "Explorify" as a way of pupils revisiting prior learning and also developing scientific skills. The Explorify sessions are approximately fifteen minutes long so we are trialling them at 9am on Friday mornings so that we can get our brains going quickly and also to accommodate the sessions in an already packed timetable. We would be very grateful if pupils can be in promptly for this, thank you. We have noticed how well the pupils are settling to their early morning activities and how these help them to revisit prior learning, edit current learning and use the library. It is also an ideal opportunity to hear pupils read. After half term, we will be arranging an open session to provide parents, carers and families with the opportunity to come into school to see how we are teaching reading across the school. We will let you know the date as soon as possible.
