School Improvement:

On Monday, our Academy Improvement Officer, Mr Swait, visited the school to look into our phonics and reading provision. He observed lessons, watched whole class reading and spoke to pupils. We had really positive feedback and are all really pleased with the impact that the hard work is having on improving this aspect of the curriculum. We have also received positive feedback from parents about the RWI (our new phonics and reading scheme), thank you so much for sharing this with us as feedback is hugely important to us as a school.

Mr Elliott has attended his final Maths subject leader course and is preparing to develop his new role further. He will start by carrying out some observations of Maths lessons, looking at pupil books and speaking to pupils across the school to gauge their thoughts about the subject. This will help him prioritise areas to develop and create an action plan.
