Mr Payton has attended PE subject leader training in order to develop his role even further. He has already made a huge impact in PE since taking on the role, but his passion and aspiration for this area of the curriculum is reflected in his vision to develop not just the teaching and learning but developing competition opportunities too.

Trust teaching staff attended a remote Visible Learning session this week where we shared our Impact Cycles. Our focus remains on developing metacognition, specifically focusing on pupils' self-awareness and self-motivation. We have seen great progress in this already this academic year but continue to build upon this.

We hope that the money raised from the project will support our enrichment trip to the Steam Ship Great Britain later in the term when we explore the life and legacy of Isambard Kingdom Brunel.

Oke Tor have an exciting term ahead. This half-term will see us looking at the Ancient Greeks and identifying the legacy left behind and using different sources to unpick the era. We have been very fortunate this week and were the first class to experience Andaras' new Woodland Skills Centre. Within our day, we learnt different ways of how to create fire and identifying the roles of each source.
